Photojournalism Angle/Perspective Project

Presentation Due Date _____ (Minor Project Grade)

Assignment Objectives:

To develop your vision as a photographer by changing your perspectives as you shoot. To provide practice time with the camera as you become familiar with its functions and controls.

For this assignment you will take pictures working with different angles/perspectives. No classmates may be in your photos. Show the whole object for the photo categories below.

Photos 1-5: Choose any ONE object and shoot it from above, right side, left side, front, and back. Each side of your object must be unique so we can see the differences. Do NOT stage your object – leave it where you find it. If you can't move around it, don't use it.

Photo 6: Find a large object and make it look smaller or less powerful/important.

Photo 7: Find a small object and make it look larger or more powerful/important.

Photos 8 & 9: Take two photos of different objects from a worms' eye view.

Photos 10 & 11: Take two photos of different objects from a birds' eye view.

Create a PowerPoint with 12 slides. Slide 1 will be a title slide with the project name and your name and class period. Each image (11) must be on its own slide with the date, location, & angle/topic above. Put the photos in the order listed above.

You will present your PowerPoint to the class. You will print your PowerPoint as Handouts with 6 slides per page.

Grading Criteria:

- Crisp focus sharp focus is one of the first things that everyone notices about an image. Blurry images are not acceptable.
- Clear center of interest the chosen object should be the center of interest.
- Fill the frame establish your center of interest and exclude competing background details. There should be very little background and any that does show should complement the main subject.
- Lighting does the available lighting enhance the element?
- Creativity is the approach creative?
